



Calev Myers

Calev Myers was born in Williamsport, Pennsylvania, and immigrated to Israel in 1992. He graduated from Hebrew University of Jerusalem and became a licensed member of the Israeli Bar Association. Today, Myers works as a partner at Yehuda Raveh & Co. Law Offices. The firm was established in the 1940s by Gideon Hausner who served as the Attorney-General of Israel and as a cabinet minister. Today, the firm has grown into one of the leading law firms in Israel that benefits from over 60 years of experience in the areas of civil and commercial law. The firm has offices throughout the country including in Jerusalem, Tel Aviv, Haifa, and Beer Sheba—the four major cities in Israel—with a staff of approximately 90 employees, 16 partners, and 81 legal and administrative staff members.

Myers serves as General Counsel to over 30 non-profit organizations in Israel focusing upon education, humanitarian needs, social justice, and civil rights. He has served as Legal Counsel to the Chairman of the Knesset Social Welfare Lobby and works together with Knesset Members and Government Ministers to carry out humanitarian projects for impoverished sectors of the Israeli society. Myers currently serves as Founder and Chief Counsel of the Jerusalem Institute of Justice, a non-profit organization which grants legal representation to Israeli residents suffering from civil discrimination on the basis of their religious background.

In addition to his professional activities, Myers is an inspirational speaker and serves as a congregational leader at Congregation Shemen Sasson, a non-denominational indigenous congregation of Israeli Evangelical believers, where he teaches regularly and leads a home-cell group.
