BASKETBALL



Coach John Dunlap enters his seventh year at Southeastern after 13 years as the head coach at Webber International University. As a head coach, he has won a NCCAA National title in 2005, collected more than 300 wins, two appearances at the NAIA National

Tournament, and a perfect 17-0 Florida Sun Conference record in 1992-93. Coach Dunlap was also a two-time Florida Sun Conference "Coach of the Year" recipient.

In his six years at Southeastern he has compiled a record of 145-71. Last season, Coach Dunlap led the team to a 24-10 overall record and a 13-3 in the South Region. Coach Dunlap won Southeastern's first NCAA Div I game in its history against Savannah State University, and is extremely excited to be a part of Southeastern athletics.



TENNIS



Coach Elizabeth Middleton is entering her second season as the tennis coach. She played at NCAA Division I Oral Roberts University where she led the team to a perfect 9-0 record her senior year and to the NCAA Nationals three of the four years she was there. After college Middleton moved to Texas to

become the assistant men's and women's tennis coach at NCAA Div. I, University of Texas Pan American. She then served as a tennis professional at the Foothills Swim & Racquet Club in Colorado Springs and at the Creek Club in Locust Valley, New York before coming to Southeastern.

SOCCER



Coach Dominic Stross has just completed his third season as head coach after assisting in the 2004 season. In his second season at the helm, he finished 5th at the NCCAA National Tournament. This year was another strong one as they finished 17-3-2 with a South region championship and a fifth place finish at Nationals. In its fifth year

in existence, Coach Stross has managed to bring the women's soccer program to an elite status in just a few years.

Coach Stross played mid-field for Florida Southern from 1993-96, where he was a captain and named "Best Mid-Fielder" his senior year.



Coach Drew Stacey enters his fourth season as head coach after two years as an assistant. He finished the year with a 16-5-1 record, finishing second at the NCCAA Div. II Nationals. Coach Stacey has a career record of 60-26-3, winning the program's third NCCAA South Region Championship in thirteen years. In 2004, the Fire finished fourth

at the NCCAA National Tournament winning their first championship in 2006.

After four years in the Marines, Coach Stacey came home looking to play soccer again. He found the Lakeland Lions, a local men's league that competed in the largest amateur league in the Florida Sun Coast League. He obtained priceless knowledge from the Lions where he retired in 2000, after they reached the finals of the Men's State Cup. This year was named Regional & National Coach of the Year.

BASEBALL



Coach Jason Beck is entering his fourth season at Southeastern. Last year he accumulated a record of 48-17 ending the season with a third NCCAA Div. II National Championship.

He has a career record of 143-56 over his time here. He has come to Lakeland from Nyack College in New York; where he posted a record of 136-125 winning a NCAA Div. II conference title his last year. Coach Beck has had the privilege of coaching ten players that have signed professional contracts to play baseball.

This year, he should pass the 300 win plateau as well. Coach Beck also played at Nyack from 1989-92 where he played first base, pitched and was named team captain his sophomore year. He is a two-time National Coach of the Year winner.
